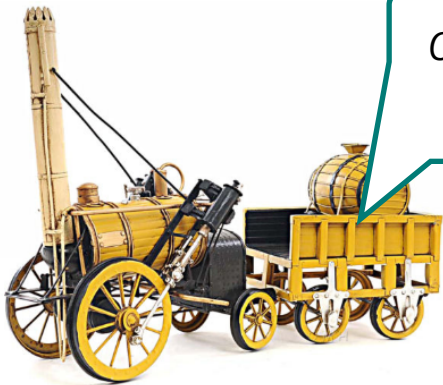

Henry Ford	An American business man who owned the Ford Motor Company and developed mass production of cars.
Wright brothers	Orville and Wilbur Wright, brothers, who invented and built the world's first successful aeroplane.

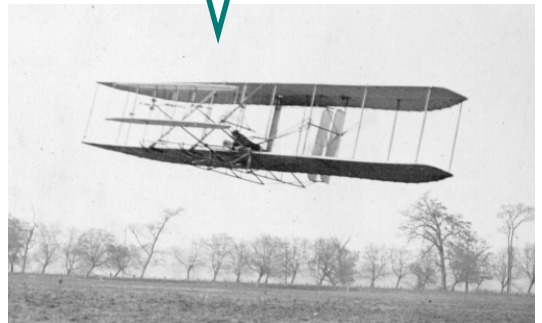
John Alexander Brodie		
Birth place	1858	Shropshire
Early work	1875	Brodie worked as an engineer in Liverpool, working on the Mersey Docks.
Return to Liverpool	1898	After working in Spain, he became a city engineer and suggested improvements such as a ring road, the electric tram and the East Lancashire Road.
New Delhi	1912	Brodie was asked to select the site and plan the city of New Delhi, India.
Legacy	1934	In 1934, Liverpool City Council named Brodie Avenue in his honour.
