Classification Terms			
Kingdom	There are 5 kingdoms: Animal, Plant, Protocista, Fungi and Monera (bacteria)		
Phylum	There are more than 30 phyla in the Animal Kingdom and 9 or 10 in the Plant Kingdom. Phylum Chordata is the one that we are the most familiar with as it includes humans, birds, fish and all other vertebrates.		
Class	The various phyla are divided into classes. Phylum Chordata is divided into amphibians, birds, mammals, reptiles and fish.		
Order	There is often disagreement about the order of a living thing. Different sources group creatures in different orders and families.		
Family	This is a way scientists group similar genera (genus) together.		
Genus	Two or more species that share unique characteristics.		
Species	A group of individuals that breed together to produce fertile offspring.		

Naming species				
The genus is the first part of the scientific name of a species.	Felis catus	The species is the second part of the name.
