



## Year 4 and 5 The Roman Empire

### Key vocabulary

Province	Territory ruled over by a Roman governor and protected by Roman soldiers
Centurion	Powerful soldier in command of a century of troops
Legion	Around 5000 troops sent to different provinces to keep control
Julius Caesar	Consul of Rome who was murdered for becoming too powerful
Octavian	Caesar's nephew who defeated Mark Anthony and Cleopatra to become Rome's 'first citizen'
aqueducts	Used to carry fresh water to towns and cities
Nero	Last of Julius Caesar's family to rule Rome. Lover of music and games but also very cruel. Murdered thousands of Christians
Vesuvius	Volcano on the outskirts of Pompeii that erupted in 79 AD
Judea	Roman province containing thousands of Jews that rebelled. Roman legions destroyed Judea and its temple


