Webpage	A single screen/page of information on a <u>website</u> .
Website	All the webpages and data contained within one domain.
Domain	The domain shows the <u>category</u> or geographical area that an internet address belongs to. e.g. .com .org or .co.uk
Hypertext	A way of digitally <u>connecting</u> pieces of text via links so that you can <u>go</u> quickly and <u>directly</u> from one to another.
Purpose	The purpose of something is the <u>reason</u> for which it is made or done.
Browser	A browser is a piece of computer software that you use to search for information on the internet.
Copyright	If someone has copyright on a piece of work, it is <u>illegal</u> to <u>reproduce</u> it without their <u>permission</u> .
Homepage	On a website, the home page is the main (often first) page of information which often contains links to other pages.
Navigation	Getting from one place (or page) to another by an efficient means.

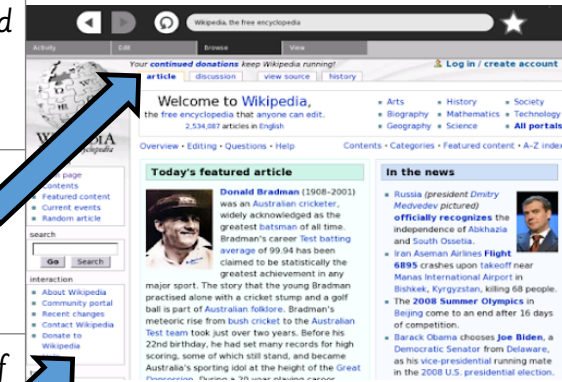

Features of Websites

Webpages are made up of a code called Hypertext Markup Language (HTML). You can find this by right-clicking on a page and selecting 'Inspect.'

The menus at the top of the page allow you to look at different parts of the website.
