



Year 4 Photo Editing

Photography	The <u>skill</u> , <u>job</u> , or process of producing photographs.
Editing	The process of changing, correcting or adapting something
Software	Computer programs or apps are referred to as software
Crop	Cut part of an image off, in order to <u>get rid</u> of part of the <u>picture</u> or to be able to <u>frame</u> it.
Rotate/Flip	Turn an image by 90 degrees or flip it to make a 180 degree mirror image
Copy	Make a duplicate of pixel information ready to paste in a new place.
Luminosity	How light something is - a measure of how close an image or colour is to pure white something is or pure black.
Contrast	The degree of difference between the <u>darker</u> and <u>lighter</u> parts of a photograph .
Enlarge	To make an image or part bigger.
Reduce	To make an image or part smaller.

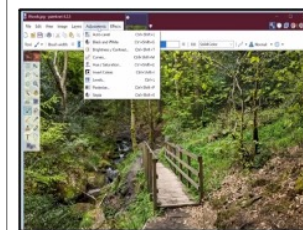

Handy Tools

The adjustments tab allows us to change the colour, contrast and luminosity of the image.



Recolour allows us to replace one colour with another.



The Clone Stamp copies pixels from one area of the picture to another.



The Magic Wand tool allows us to select areas of pixels with a similar colour.
